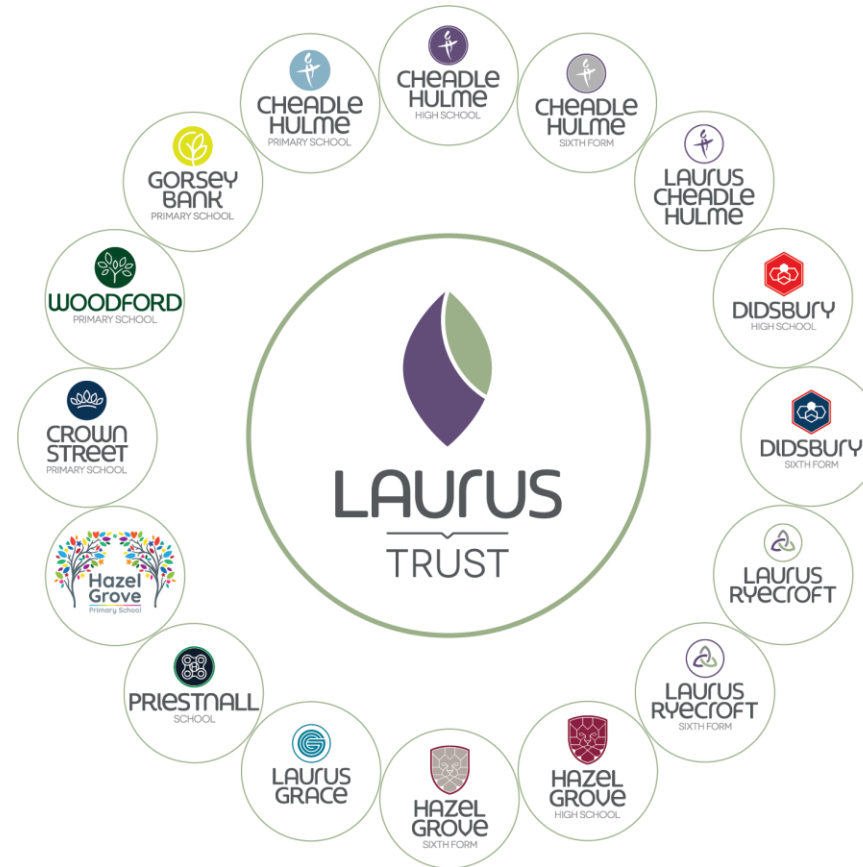

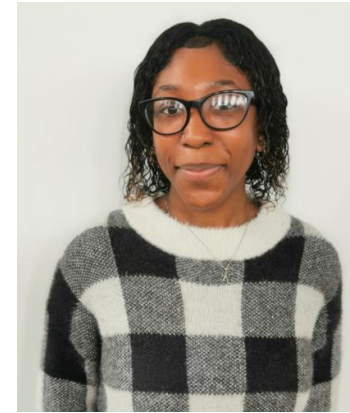

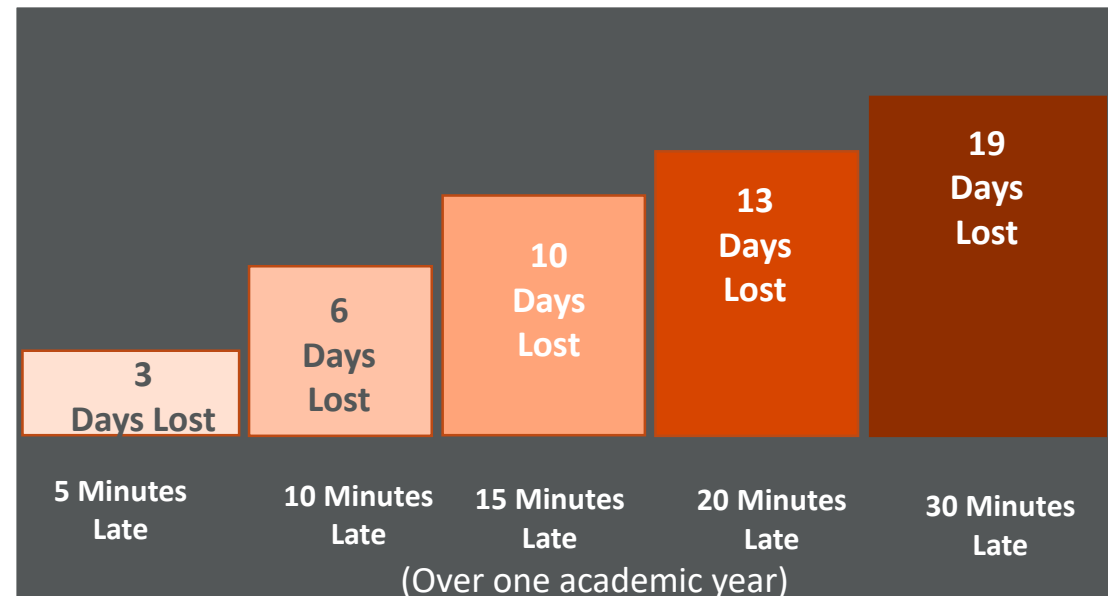

Funding



HM Government

15 hours childcare for all families in England



For children aged 3-4 years.

How to apply

Tax-Free Childcare

Get up to £2,000 per child and up to £4,000 where the child is disabled.

15 & 30 hours childcare for eligible working families in England



Currently available for children aged 2-4 years

Accepting applications for 9-23 months old for September 2024 from 12 May

How to apply

Who can benefit from it?

- For working families, including the self-employed, in the UK.
- Earning up to £100k and an average of £184 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each over three months.
- Who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers.
- With children aged 0-11 (or 0-16 if disabled).
- For every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year, £4,000 if the child is disabled.



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Funding

Get extra funding for your early years provider

If your child is in early years education, your early years provider could be eligible for extra funding to help support your child.

Early years pupil premium

Your child's early years education provider could get up to £353 per year to help with your child's education. This will be paid direct to your provider.

Who can apply

You can apply for early years pupil premium if your child is aged 3 or 4 and you get [15 hours free childcare](#).

You must also get at least one of the following:

- [Income Support](#)
- income-based [Jobseeker's Allowance](#)
- income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#)
- support under [part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#)
- the guaranteed element of [State Pension Credit](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#) (provided you are not also entitled to [Working Tax Credit](#)) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- [Working Tax Credit](#) run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

Lunchtime

- Should you choose a school meal – you will be charged £2.70 per day.
- You need to order your child's lunch via the School Grid App, where you can choose from a choice of meals.
- You may wish to provide a healthy packed lunch. We are allergy aware and do not allow nuts of any form in school.



Snack Time

We take part in the School Fruit Scheme, whereby each child in Reception receives a free piece of fruit or veg each day.



Milk Scheme

All pupils aged 4 years old and younger will be entitled to free milk everyday until their 5th birthday. To address any dietary requirements, non-dairy alternative can be brought into school for staff to give to your child.

What do the children need to bring to school every day?

- School water bottle*
- Spare change of clothes
- Waterproofs + wellies
- Seasonal – winter hat/scarf, sun hat etc.

What should your child practise to prepare them for school?

- Using the toilet independently and washing hands
- Putting on/taking off their jumper/cardigan
- Fastening coat and shoes
- Using a knife and fork for lunch
- Listening to stories
- Singing nursery rhymes
