Castlefield Viaduct Visit

So today was a rather exciting day as – we went on our first educational visit to Castlefield Viaduct (*technically second*, *but the archaeological dig site we visited in March was only at the end of the road!*). With it being another first for us, it was always going to be special, but this was even more special because we were going to view artwork that **we** created and is now on display at a National Trust site – how cool is that?!

During our visit we were able to explore the viaduct and look at the different flowers, plants and minibeasts that can be found all around – we spotted lots of different types of bees. We got a chance to plant some wild flowers (in pots that we decorated) and were able to share our knowledge about how seeds grow – these will be coming home with the children at some point next week. And finally, we were able to see our artwork on display! Lots of children were able to spot their individual pieces and appreciated how beautiful it was as a collaborative piece.

The children were incredible throughout the morning with their safe and sensible walking and their enthusiasm and manners whilst we were there – well done to them all - we are all so incredibly proud of you! The children were sent home today with a little gift pack from National Trust which includes some wild flower seeds to plant at home! A huge thank you to the team at Crown Street Primary in their efforts in organising and supporting the visit, and also to our very kind parent helpers – we really appreciated your time and support this morning, so thank you.

We feel very honoured that Beth and her team at Castlefield Viaduct reached out to us about the opportunity to create some artwork for them, very grateful to the team at Manchester's Little Artists who facilitated such a wonderful and creative session in which our children were so engaged and inspired, and so very proud of our children who have created such beautiful artwork. Although we are still excited that our artwork is on show for all to see at Castlefield Viaduct, we look forward to it travelling to us and going up on permanent display in our school.

We highly recommend visiting Castlefield Viaduct as we our so lucky to have such a beautiful green space on our doorstep, but also to view our artwork which is on display until 31^{st} May. The full art exhibition, including the touring piece that our children collaborated on is also there this weekend $(17^{th} - 18^{th})$, and will then travel to its final location of Dunham Massey next weekend $(24^{th} - 25^{th})$ May. Your pink passes are valid until 1^{st} June – so please use them!

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School Uniform

A reminder that it is our policy that children wear school uniform when attending school. We ask that the items (and colours) specified in our Uniform Policy are the only items/colours that children wear. You can find our policy and what is included as uniform on the 'School Uniform' page on our website. Please can we also ask that no jewellery, with the exception of stud earrings, is to be worn to school.

No toys in school

Please could we ask that children **do not** bring in toys from home into school. All children need to bring into school are items of uniform (including weather-specific items, e.g. sun hats and sunglasses), water bottles and their school book/s (library book, plus Phonics book and Reading Record for Reception children). Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Assembly this week

This week, our assembly focused on road safety ahead of our visit at the end of the week. We discussed the importance of road safety and some of the steps we need to take – including stopping before walking across/on a road, using different crossings or finding a safe space to cross, looking and listening to the traffic, and crossing with supervision from an adult. The children shared examples of how they are road aware and how they stay safe whilst walking and/or crossing roads.

Safety Drill Practice

Following our assembly last week, about the different alarms we have in school to keep us all safe and what to do if we hear them – we had a practice. When the alarm sounded, the children all listened carefully and followed the instructions of the adults. It is important for us to take time to practice these different drills, so that should we ever need to follow one the children feel familiar with what to do and confident in doing it.
