
Interested in becoming a teacher?

Assembly this week

This week, our assembly was based around the book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers (definitely one of my all time favourite authors!).



This book provides some 'notes' on how to begin to understand the

different parts of our planet – like space, the land and the sea, and then of course the different animals and people that we have on our planet. As we read the book and discussed the (rather brilliant) illustrations and the children were able to share their thoughts and ask questions about the different parts of our planet. Throughout the story we were able to link the book to our **Character Trait** of **Citizenship** as we become aware of the world around us and begin to understand that we have a part to play within this world. We talked about how although all people may come in different shapes, sizes and colours - we are all people. This then led us to discussing our Character Trait of Kindness, because although parts of our planet and world can be complicated, things can be simple too – we just have to be kind.
