Assembly this week

In keeping with our visit from Adele, and it being International Women in Engineering Day, I shared a book with the children called 'Rosie Revere, Engineer' by Andrea Beaty. A book about following your dreams and not



giving up. It tells the story of Rosie, who loves to create and build different gadgets and gizmos, but loses confidence when things don't work. However, she soon learns that if something doesn't work first time, it isn't a failure - the failure would be giving up, so instead to keep on trying and to learn from our attempts and mistakes. We talked about this in relation to not giving up when our learning might get tricky, or if something doesn't go the way we wanted - like when we build in the construction area - to use this to try again. We shared the word resilience and linked to our school rule of 'We try our best'. We also talked about Bravery – how Rosie was brave to try again and brave to encourage others to believe in themselves too.
